Expanding God's Kingdom at St John's

As we prepare to celebrate Pentecost this June, we are reminded of that extraordinary moment when the Church was born not in silence or stillness, but in fire, wind, and bold proclamation.

The disciples were filled with the Holy Spirit and sent out into the world to bear witness to the risen Christ. Pentecost is not just a moment in history, it is a living call to the Church today.

Here at St John's, we take this calling seriously. As members of Christ's body - we are invited not only to gather but to go to reach out in love, to share the good news, and to live as people transformed by the Spirit of God. Pentecost invites us to reflect on what it truly means to be Church: Spirit-filled, outward looking, and deeply committed to the mission of Jesus.



At the heart of our life together is this sacred purpose:

To make God's love known not only within our walls, but throughout our community in Potters Bar.

We believe that true growth lies not just in numbers, but in deepening discipleship in lives that reflect Christ's light and compassion. That is why outreach is so vital. It's not just about publicity or programmes, it's about presence. It's about showing up in people's lives with kindness, welcome and faith. Outreach

opens the door, but what follows - worship, fellowship, discipleship and service - forms the rhythm of real church life.

As we look to the future, we're excited by the vision of appointing a Mission and Outreach Worker to help us deepen this work in our community. We are actively exploring grant opportunities and seeking support, with the hope of having someone in post by January 2026. But this is not a one-person job. This is our shared calling. We invite every member and friend of St John's to be part of this holy work, not as spectators, but as Spirit-led participants in God's mission. This is not just about hiring someone to "do outreach" for us, it's about reimagining Church as a community that is open, courageous, and present in the world.

Together, let's build this vision on a foundation of prayer and purpose, so that we may see lives renewed and God's love made visible among us. We believe the Spirit is already at work leading, prompting, preparing. Let us now step forward together, in faith and courage.



Coffee at St John's



I am pleased to update that following a shortfall in 2023 in the amount of money donated to cover for the cost of providing refreshments each week, last year we saw a surplus of £600. At the February Church Council meeting it was agreed that we would send that to our 2024 Christmas Charity, Noah's Ark. It costs more than £1,000 a year to purchase all of the various products; where relevant, these are Fairtrade, with the addition this year of gluten and dairy free biscuits and a dairy-alternative milk for those with these dietary needs. However, I am afraid to report that across some recent weeks, we have not seen donations on a Sunday anywhere close to the amount we need to cover the cost

of providing the service, let alone work towards a surplus we can donate to charity at the end of the year. We might end up with a shortfall again, that would have to be covered from other church giving. Please do remember to put a donation into one of the money boxes, or make a donation with our card reader, when you pick up your drink and biscuit!

20 Years Since the Official Opening of the Clifton Room



We have something to celebrate - this month - at St John's - it is 20 years since the official opening of the Clifton Room by the late John Motson on Saturday 4 June 2005. What a truly joyful occasion that was. The room is named after the Clifton family, who with a very generous bequest together with various grants from Methodist funds, enabled the project to get off the ground. Looking back over the last 20 years, the difference the Clifton Room and other alterations to the church have made to the life of the church is quite remarkable. Sadly, some of the members so closely involved with the whole rebuilding project, are no longer with us, but all those still around remember the pre and post years very clearly.

Previously, steps into the church prevented anyone with mobility issues coming in through the main doors, meaning they had to enter at the back and then come through the doors at the front of the church. The ramp has made such a difference to accessibility for everyone and the Welcome Stewards can greet everyone equally. Various photos show very clearly how the work progressed.

We also remember how the tea and coffee was served after the service. The large trolley from the kitchen was wheeled into the front of the church and parked on a large plastic sheet. We queued up and then went back to our seats, sitting in rows where conversation was limited to those we were sitting next too. What a difference the Clifton Room has made – a warm welcoming space, where we can sit and chat with everyone, especially those new to our church. It is not only on a Sunday that it comes into its own – Friday Coffee, Women's Guild, Welcome Space, Church Council, Alpha courses, CTPB prayer meetings and many other meetings can take place in comfort, with the attractive coffee bar making hot drinks available directly in the room. Recently, we have started having Café Worship in there, which has been well received. I have to admit the Clifton Room, apart from all its other advantages, holds a very special place in my heart for family reasons.

A very special mention must be made to all those so closely involved, in months/years of hard work before it all came

to fruition. There was a huge amount of planning and reorganisation, with Services continuing in the Main Hall, for some months, whilst the work in Worship Area was taking place. Whilst all the main building work was undertaken by the contracted builders, including redecorating the Worship area and Main Hall, a decision was made to renovate the rest of the church premises at the same time. This involved a team of voluntary workers, who spent many hours painting and decorating, putting new tiled ceilings in the Garden Room, Rainbow Room and back corridor, changing lighting and much more. In addition, though it hadn't been planned to renovate the kitchen at that time, as funds were so tight, a timely, generous bequest was received and the new kitchen was not long in following the rest of the renovations.



Various committees were set up, or enlarged, including Property and Finance, Décor and Colour Schemes and Fund raising. We held several fetes and other fund-raising events, with so many people involved in these. As well as fund raising for the church, our then Minister, Paul Beard, requested we adopt an overseas project, which led to us supporting a successful venture "High Schools in Mozambique."

On **Sunday 8 June** let us remember all that has been achieved by joining together in the Clifton Room for coffee or tea and cake.
