

Revd David Jebb is our Minister at St John's Methodist Church and Superintendent Minister of the St Albans & Welwyn Circuit, overseeing the work of nine churches and one Mission Project and one Methodist Centre. He has ministered in several circuits across England and brings a strong missional focus, valuing contemporary and formal worship styles and flexible approaches that help people encounter Christ and grow as disciples.

Dr Paul Dakin is a retired medical doctor who dedicates a significant time to local preaching. He comes from the Cuffley area so is fairly local. He has always been close to the Methodist denomination. Paul has preached here before and his style and message is always thought provoking.

Gerry Cohen was brought up in a North London Jewish family. He co-leads Beit Sar Shalom, the Messianic congregation of Chosen People Ministries in London, and serves as Vice-President of the British Messianic Jewish Alliance. He works as a secondary school teacher of Philosophy, Religion and Ethics, and is actively involved in professional RE organisations.

Dr George Woods has been a Local Preacher since 1998 in the Johannesburg East Circuit of the Methodist Church of Southern Africa, before transferring to the St Albans and Welwyn Circuit. He has recently taken up the role of Diocesan Secretary and Chief Executive Officer for the Diocese of Ely, where he also oversees safeguarding. He also lectures part-time for two universities.

Please join us for our new series of themed services. As our Minister, Revd David Jebb writes:



St John's - Mission Outreach Enabler Update – Good News!



Since we last spoke to the whole church on a Sunday before Christmas a lot has happened. The core team met the January District Grant deadline and we are delighted to report that our submission was successful. We have been given just under £40,000 which, alongside funds from the church and circuit will enable us to go ahead.

We prayerfully believe that St John's and Shenley stand together at a crossroads. God is summoning us to amplify our witness as a place of grace and welcome – *a 'vibrant river of living water, flowing into the arid places of our community (John 7:38)'*. We want to offer opportunities for all to encounter the living God and through the witness of the Holy Spirit, to come to know and follow Jesus.

Whilst we may well have historically aging congregations, it is also true that we are blessed with the seeds of **new life. At St John's we have new people, greater diversity, new families at creative church, a wonderful worship group and large uniformed organisations to name but a few areas for which we are thankful.** In total over 450 people use our building every week. At Shenley the thriving messy church connects with 80-90 children and **adults alongside their regular 'Let's Play' toddler sessions.** All of which forms a sound basis for future witness and growth.

So we aim to bring someone new into this mix who has the time and skills to encourage, support and enable our mission, building relationships with the local communities of Potters Bar and Shenley across all ages. This will be achieved in partnership with Church folk and the role will aim to strengthen both the community and the church, **fostering spiritual growth, discipling people into the family of God and promoting the church's values of compassion and inclusion.** We will advertise after Easter, hopefully appoint at the end of June for a September start.

Please pray for the next steps, for Rev David our minister and above all, that we might find the right person for this important role.

St John's Nursery Playgroup Update



After welcoming Nikki Haylock as the new manager of our playgroup at St John's in September 2025 suddenly we are already two thirds of our way through the school year! In this time the staff team plus the playgroup board members have got to know Nikki well, and in return Nikki has got to know both the staff plus various members of the church too. This proved helpful when introducing new laptops and software to help modernise the database which had become increasingly time consuming, and now allows more joint working plus providing a 'parent app' for communicating with parents. The playgroup has also set up an Amazon Wishlist on <https://amzn.eu/0cm3RoCO> so parents, friends, colleagues and members of the church can donate, which has been well supported so far but future donations would still be gratefully received!

A visit from an Early Years Advisor suggested essential safeguarding improvements by installing a more secure entry system and a new perimeter fence outside. This is all in line with Ofsted regulations who earlier this month visited our other Playgroup setting at Wayside. We are awaiting the official report from Ofsted which will be published soon.

We were saddened to hear that Chris Jones, a previous long-standing member of staff, passed away last month. **Chris' husband, Colin, tells us that Chris worked at the playgroup for 25 years from 1990 - 2014** and was the staff member who younger staff often looked up to for advice with caring for children at the playgroup. Chris had been living in Cooperscroft Care Home for almost exactly one year and the playgroup would like to extend their condolences to Colin and family.

Shenley Methodist Church Strengthens Community Mission

Shenley Methodist Church is experiencing significant growth in its mission and ministry through our thriving initiatives that are drawing people from across Hertfordshire and beyond. Messy Church, playgroup, monthly fellowships, sales and coffee meetups have **become central expressions of the church's** commitment to hospitality, creativity, and intergenerational engagement.



Messy Church: A Monthly Gathering of Creativity and Faith

Held on the first Sunday of each month from 4pm to 6pm, Messy Church at Shenley has developed into a vibrant and welcoming space for children, young people, and their families. Each event offers a carefully planned programme of themed activities, including craft, storytelling, games, and opportunities for creative exploration of Christian faith culminating in a shared meal at the end of each session.

Attendance regularly reaches 50–60 participants, with families travelling from Shenley, Borehamwood, Radlett, London Colney, St Albans, Potters Bar, and even parts of Bedfordshire. The ministry has become known for its warm atmosphere, thoughtful content, and the way it enables families to engage with faith through hands-on, imaginative experiences.

Let's Play: Weekly Support for Local Families

Complementing this monthly gathering is Let's Play, which meets every Tuesday from 10:30am to 12 noon. Designed for babies, toddlers, and their carers, the group offers a light breakfast, a wide range of toys and activities, and weekly themed crafts and messy play. Parents and grandparents play an active role in the ministry, assisting in the kitchen and serving refreshments with care, generosity, and a strong **sense of community spirit**. Let's Play has become a **valued meeting place for local families**, providing social connection, mutual support, and a safe environment for children to play and grow.



Monthly Fellowship

On the second Monday of each month our doors are open from 2pm to join for coffee, cake & conversation. Often includes a theme, guest speaker or activity. Very informal, relaxed space for everyone to enjoy.

Spring Presbyteral Synod Meeting – 11th March 2026



It was a privilege to welcome the Bedfordshire, Essex and Hertfordshire Methodist Presbyteral Synod to St John's Methodist Church in Potters Bar on Wednesday, 11th March 2026. The day began in the most perfect way gathered around the Lord's Table for a service of Holy Communion, as active presbyters and supernumeraries from across the Circuit came together in worship. Around 60 presbyters joined us in person from across the BEH District, with others connecting online through a seamlessly organised hybrid - a beautiful blend of technology and tradition that enabled so many to participate.

The warmth of our welcome was matched only by the warmth of our hospitality, and it was deeply touching to hear how much that care was appreciated. Every detail was prayerfully considered and lovingly carried out by a wonderful team of volunteers, whose dedication ensured the day ran smoothly and gracefully. It was a true expression of what it means to be the body of Christ, serving together with joy.

One of the highlights of the morning was a fascinating and thought-provoking presentation on Cross-Cultural Ministry in Britain, led by the Revd Chris Sandy. This was followed by a time of consultation and reflection on the Presbyteral session of the annual Methodist Conference, with the Revd Mark Hammonds, Revd David Jebb, and Revd Zena Smith sharing insights from their own Conference experiences offering wisdom, encouragement, and a real sense of connection to the wider Methodist family.

At lunchtime, we shared a simple but heartwarming meal of soup and French rolls with our own packed lunches — but oh, what soup it was! The homemade soup, lovingly prepared by Barbara Thompson and served by her wonderful team of volunteers, was a gift in itself and nourished not only our bodies but our sense of community.

The afternoon session continued with a report from the District Probationers Committee, and it was a moment of great joy and anticipation when the Synod approved two probationers for ordination at the Methodist Conference in June, in Telford, Shropshire. Their faithful journey towards ordained ministry is a cause for celebration and prayer across the District.

There were also moments of deep emotion and profound gratitude. We heard moving farewell speeches from three presbyters who had sought permission to become supernumerary. The Synod responded with heartfelt thanks for their faithful ministries and their witness to the gospel, granting them permission to step down at the end of the connexional year, subject to confirmation at Conference. Their legacy of service will long be remembered.

Pastoral letters were sent from the Synod to those among us facing difficult times whether in health or other personal struggles as a tangible sign that they are held in prayer and love. And then came the solemn and deeply precious time of the annual obituaries. Tribute was paid to the lives and ministries of the late Revd Anne Davies, Revd Rowland Joiner, and Revd Peter Hudson. Their names were spoken with love, their stories shared with reverence, and we held a time of prayer, giving thanks for all they meant to us and to the Church. The tributes were read by their Superintendent Ministers.



We closed with a brief update on stationing, hearing that the Conference will be reviewing new stationing arrangements in the years ahead, and then we gathered for a closing prayer led by the Chair of the District. With grateful hearts, we wished him a peaceful and restorative three-month sabbatical may it be a true gift of rest and renewal. The date was set for our next Presbyteral Synod: Wednesday 10th March 2027 at Trinity Methodist Church, Biggleswade (North Bedfordshire Circuit) . We look forward already to gathering again.

Finally, from the bottom of my heart—thank you. A huge and heartfelt thank you to the 19 wonderful people who **worked so tirelessly and joyfully to make this day possible**. From St John's and the WI: David C, David B, Chris H, Barbara T, Lynn, Valerie, Pat, Jackie, June, and Hilary. And from the Circuit: Stuart, Alan C, John, Joanna, Rosemary M, Daniel, Autumn, Lewis and Leanna. You gave your time, your energy, and your love and it made all the difference. I am so deeply grateful to you all.
