

From our Minister – Revd David Jebb

On May 24, 1738, Anglican priest John Wesley experienced a life-changing spiritual awakening at a small gathering on Aldersgate Street, London. Though deeply devoted to his faith, Wesley had long wrestled with doubts about his salvation. That evening, as he listened to a reading from Martin Luther's Preface to the Epistle to the Romans, he felt his "heart strangely warmed". In that moment, he gained a deep assurance that Christ had truly saved him - even him - and he placed his trust fully in Christ alone.



Even today - 287 years later - Wesley's passion, discipline, and vision continue to inspire millions across the globe. Methodism is still growing, transforming lives and communities with its message of grace, holiness, and love in action. If you'd like to explore more of Wesley's incredible story, a visit to the Wesley Chapel at City Road and Museum of Methodism in London offers a powerful glimpse into his life and legacy.



As we mark this important anniversary in May, we give thanks for our founder, John Wesley, whose "strangely warmed heart" continues to set hearts ablaze around the world.

Today, there are over 84 million Methodists worldwide, and the movement continues to grow rapidly. This growth is fuelled by a passionate heart for evangelism, a deep commitment to community outreach, and a willingness to meet people wherever they are - both spiritually and practically.

Methodists are engaged in countless social and missional projects that inspire people to follow Christ personally and live out their faith through acts of love and service. The spirit of Aldersgate lives on as we reach out to those who have yet to experience the saving grace of Jesus Christ.

Let us be encouraged and empowered to continue this mission today. "The best of all is, God is with us." – John Wesley's final words

GOOD FRIDAY SERVICE - Members of the Churches together in Potters Bar united to mark Good Friday by participating in a Walk of Witness and Open Air Service at the War Memorial near Oakmere Park to reflect on the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The open-air service, led by clergy and lay leaders from a range of Christian communities across the town and attended by over 120 people, was marked by hymn singing, scripture and prayers – and focussed on the hope, redemption and promise of new life that is central to the Easter Story. The Chair of CTPB, Rev David Jebb, finished the service by saying "May we continue walking together in the love and life of Christ ... sharing the hope of the Gospel not only on Good Friday, but every day".

Thank You From Whitechapel Mission

Whitechapel is very very grateful to St John's for the very generous gift as a result of the Harvest Appeal last year. The final total received was £4,097.39 including Gift Aid, plus 4 large boxes of food and a full carload of clothing.

Provision of services to the homeless is currently a very great challenge – currently more demanding than we have ever seen before. Unfortunately the numbers have grown greatly, but also vary considerably from day to day – which makes planning tricky! In the past a typical day saw us serve about 150 breakfasts, but on two days last week we served 248 and 379 breakfast on successive days! Even more sadly, the behaviour of the guests has deteriorated and we are having difficulties due to the differences between the many cultures who are with us and the much increased use of drugs such as crack cocaine. The effect of this is that our costs have grown, not just because of the extra food bills, but the need for additional staff and vigilance in the canteen area. This has also brought a lot of additional stress onto our staff, some of whom now need a break after working every day over the winter.

The Trustees have therefore agreed that during the summer months, starting in May, the Mission will be closed at the weekends in order to give staff a break and put in place some new ways of working, and to secure extra staff who are appropriately trained. It is felt that this way forward will minimise the disruption to our service as the weekends tend to be slightly less busy, and the opportunities don't exist to assist guests who are looking for accommodation and other professional help. Hopefully we can return to 7 day opening by October for the start of what will be the 150th year of operating for the Whitechapel Mission.

Thank you again for your great generosity. I can assure you that your donations will be put to very good use indeed.

Let's Play – A Growing Community of Love and Laughter at Shenley Methodist Church



What began more than a year ago as a small gathering of four mums and their toddlers has since blossomed into a vibrant and thriving group at Shenley Methodist Church, located on London Road. Though the church itself may be modest in size, its heart is unmistakably large - overflowing with love for the community and a deep commitment to supporting young families.

Every Tuesday from 10:30am to 12 noon, Let's Play opens its doors to welcome parents, grandparents, carers, and their little ones. It started simply—just a few mums, including Naomi Moir and Heather Moir, coming together to create a safe and joyful space for toddlers to play and for parents to connect. For the first few months, the numbers stayed small, but the atmosphere was full of warmth and genuine care.

The turning point came when the group began offering light breakfasts—delicious toast with butter and jam, accompanied by freshly brewed tea and coffee. But more than that, people found something deeper: a warm welcome, meaningful friendships, and a sense of belonging in a world that can often feel isolating for new parents.

Since then, Let's Play has grown exponentially. From just four children, the group now regularly welcomes around 35 children—along with their parents, grandparents, and carers—each week. It has become a place of fellowship and fun, where community is built not only through shared activities but through shared lives.

Though Naomi had to step down to pursue further studies, Heather has continued to lead the group with heartfelt dedication. She's been wonderfully supported by Louise and John and a few parents (taking a turn to prepare breakfast), who contribute in practical and meaningful ways. John, for instance, transformed the church side garden into a safe, inviting space where children can play freely and safely.

This year's Let's Play Easter celebration was a beautiful example of what this group has become. The day was filled with joy—crafts, painting, and a lively toddler disco with 3D sensory lights that had both children and parents dancing together. An astonishing 94 people gathered to celebrate, making it one of the most memorable days in the group's journey so far. Every child received a thoughtfully prepared Easter activity bag, lovingly put together by Nico.



The team is deeply grateful for the ongoing support from Dick, Nico, Liz and Maggie from St John's, whose contributions continue to make a difference.

If you happen to be free on a Tuesday morning, we warmly invite you to pop in and see what Let's Play is all about. Come enjoy a light breakfast, meet wonderful people, and experience firsthand the spirit of welcome, care, and joy that fills Shenley Methodist Church every week. Let's Play together Team - Shenley
