From our Minister... Mission Outreach Worker - confirmed

Dear Friends

We are excited to share with you an important and hopeful development in the life and mission of St John's Methodist Church. After months and months of prayerful reflections and strategic planning, the Mission Outreach Team, Leadership Team, General Church Meeting and finally the Church Council has approved the appointment of a part-time Mission Outreach Worker to begin in January 2026.

This new role is designed to help our church grow in mission and outreach by providing dedicated time, energy, and expertise to build meaningful connections with our local community. It is not intended to replace the invaluable work of our volunteers but to partner with them, taking our shared calling to a new level.

The Mission Outreach Worker will focus on:

- Engaging with those who are unchurched, de-churched, or on the margins of church life
- Developing ministries and activities for children, young people and families
- Strengthening connections within our congregation and extending a warm welcome to newcomers
- Collaborating with our sister church in Shenley and the circuit, organisations to enrich our shared mission

This role will be part-time (20 hours per week) with flexible hours to align with the rhythms of church and community life, including Sunday worships, evenings and weekends.

Funding and Sustainability

The project is a five-year commitment, with the total cost being shared equally between three partners: St. John's Methodist Church, the St Albans & Welwyn Circuit, and the Bedfordshire, Essex and Hertfordshire District. Each will contribute one-third of the total cost.

For St. John's, this means we will need to raise approximately £8,844 per year over the five years. The remaining two-thirds will be covered by the Circuit and District respectively. A detailed financial projection has been attached separately for your reference. (please see page 3)

As a congregation, our annual contribution to this mission amounts to approximately one-third of the total cost. This means that your prayerful support and your generous giving are vital to making this vision a reality.

Before joining us Jenet attended Methodist Churches in Romford and Amersham and has been a worship leader for 14 years. Jenet has built her career in the finance field. When not leading worship, Jenet enjoys singing with our worship band here at St John's.

Revd Dr David Mullins is a retired supernumerary (minister) living in the St Alban's area, and a member of Hatfield Road Methodist Church. David enjoys leading our worship and has preached at St John's a number of times in the past.

Revd Rosemary Mutopo has Pastoral and Worship responsibility for 4 of our circuit churches in the Hatfield and Welwyn area. She has visited St John's before and led some very thought provoking Café Church evening services.

We will continue to meet on Zoom using the same link as before (see above). It has been very encouraging to see up to 24 people joining us each Saturday morning. It's a real blessing to be able to gather in prayer together in this way.

St John's Prayer Chain

For a number of years St John's has operated a prayer chain. At present the coordinator receives urgent prayer requests which are then cascaded through the chain by telephone. The requests may be urgent either because a need has arisen in-between Sunday services, or are personal. Before a request is released to the chain permission must be obtained from the relevant person. This is to ensure confidentiality of the system.

It is recognised that the present arrangements are not perfect. Messages may be delayed within the chain, and there is also the potential for a "Chinese whisper" effect distorting the original request.

The Pastoral Co-ordinator and the Leadership Team have been reviewing the working of the prayer chain and how it can become more effective in the light of modern technology. We are investigating creating a new WhatsApp group and operating two parallel systems with members able to choose between WhatsApp or the telephone chain or both.

Assuming the WhatsApp group arrangement is feasible and safeguards are in place to ensure confidentiality of requests it is hoped a changed system can be operational by September and details will be announced in the September edition of St John's News.

Coffee with the Pastor - 21 June

On Saturday, 21st June 2025, our minister Revd David Jebb hosted a warm and welcoming afternoon gathering titled "Coffee with the Pastor" - a special opportunity for new worshippers who joined us recently at St John's to meet the Pastor and connect with members of the wider church family in a relaxed and informal setting.

The heart behind this initiative was to help new worshippers feel at home, while also offering a chance to hear their thoughts on how the church might grow particularly in Christ-centred outreach and engagement with younger age groups. The gathering highlighted the importance of building a vibrant, inclusive church community that looks confidently toward the future.

The event was attended by six adults (plus three children) who are new to St John's and had been personally invited by Revd Jebb. Genevieve - placement student from Queens College in Birmingham, David R - church steward and myself made up the numbers to 10.

Revd Jebb opened the afternoon with a warm welcome and a word of thanks to all who came. The session began with a time of sharing: each person briefly introduced themselves and spoke about their life journey and

> Christian experience. Newcomers were invited to reflect on their experience of St John's so far, what had drawn them in, what they appreciated and any suggestions they had

for the future. A delicious buffet followed featuring sandwiches, wraps, cakes, and biscuits. Given the hot summer weather, ginger beer and cold water were served in place of the usual tea and coffee - a refreshing change much appreciated by all!

The rest of the afternoon was spent in relaxed conversation, with guests chatting one-on-one and in small groups, deepening connections and beginning to build friendships. Several newcomers expressed their gratitude to Revd Jebb for organising the event, saying it made them feel more welcomed, relaxed and included in

the life of the church.

The gathering also served as a platform to share the church's broader vision including plans to employ a Mission Outreach Worker to help strengthen outreach, build community connections, and draw more people into the life and fellowship of the church.
